

# REPORT ON COOPERATION FOR DEVELOPMENT

The will of the Andorran people to extend their collaboration and efforts to the common causes of humanity is reflected in the preamble to the Andorran Constitution:

*"The Andorran people, with full liberty and independence, and in the exercise of their own sovereignty [...]*

*Eager to use every endeavour to promote values such as liberty, justice, democracy and social progress, and to keep and strengthen the harmonious relations of Andorra with the rest of the world and, especially, with the neighbouring countries, on the basis of mutual respect, coexistence and peace [...]. Willing to bring their collaboration and effort to all the common causes of mankind, and especially to those of preserving the integrity of the Earth and guaranteeing an environment fit for life for the coming generations [...]*

*Approve the present Constitution, in the exercise of their sovereignty."*

In such a globalised world, the inequalities between developed and developing countries are enlarged. Problems such as famine, access to water, war, desertification, extreme poverty, infant mortality and pandemics are phenomena often little known by the first world which in part responsible without knowing it.

The Millenium Development Goals were adopted by the Andorran Government and the other 189 members of the United Nations by consensus, and are the reason why the Department of Multilateral Affairs and Cooperation for Development was created in 2001. The Master Plan for Andorran cooperation for development has become an instrument for the strategic planning of the Andorran Government in the field of cooperation for development. It establishes the allocations of budgetary resources and the sectorial and geographical priorities, setting out coherent lines in these matters.

This Master Plan presents to the Andorran society the guidelines for the cooperation for development of the Government of Andorra, and in order to concentrate the budgetary resources in specific sectors, it establishes as priorities the areas related with the protection of the most vulnerable groups, placing a

special emphasis on all the projects focussed in children, women, disabled and elderly who live in developing countries. Water, in all its aspects (social, health and strategic), sustainable development, and the fight against climate change, complete the set of priorities of Andorran cooperation.

Courage and rigor guide Andorra in a policy of cooperation for development based on effectiveness when giving the most appropriate aid to the neediest people. Thus, from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, all actions of cooperation are channelled through four forms of action: voluntary contributions to funds and programmes of international organizations; financial and technical contributions to multilateral and bilateral projects; responses to international situations of emergency and, finally, public subsidies to Andorran civic entities for international projects.

This report sets out, in an intentionally summarised way, the activities carried out in the field of cooperation for development during the three years 2008-2010. During these years the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has responded to 43 appeals for help for humanitarian emergencies, has done 85 voluntary contributions to international bodies, has took part in the financing of 7 bilateral projects and 6 multilateral projects and has awarded 65 subsidies to Andorran civic entities.

This document will be useful in making you aware of the solidarity carried out by the Andorran Government in its activities. There is also the noteworthy role of Andorran civil society and its involvement in these causes. I trust that reading it will contribute to promoting the sensitivity towards challenges which are often as evident as ignored.

# 1. the MDG and the priorities of Andorran cooperation



---

The Millenium Development Goals resolution was adopted by the Andorran Government and the other 189 members of the United Nations by consensus during the General Assembly session of the United Nations on the 13th September 2000.

These goals constitute a programme agreed by all the states and the main world institutions dedicated to development. Since their approval, the goals have promoted unprecedented efforts in responding to the needs of the poorest people in the world. The challenge is to achieve the goals before 2015.



Andorran cooperation defines its priorities through the eight millennium goals, allocating its resources to the following sectors of activity:

### 1.1 Protection of vulnerable people:

#### *Children:*

- Reduce infant mortality.
- Fight against child exploitation.
- Promote the attendance at school in marginal areas.
- Ensure universal primary education.

#### *Gender equality in the following priority order:*

- Improve maternal health.
- Promote women's access to and control of family resources and benefits.
- Promote social and labour integration for women.
- Women empowerment.
- Help social participation and institutional development for women.
- Fight discrimination against women.

#### *Disabled and elderly people:*

- Promote social and labour integration for disabled and elderly people.
- Give access to education and fight discrimination against disabled and elderly people.

### 1.2 Water in all its aspects (social, ecological, environmental, health and strategic):

- Create structures for access to water: wells, irrigation systems.
- Ensure clean drinking, processed and safed water.
- Set up systems for water purification and accumulation.
- Recover systems for rainwater usage.
- Educate people in hygienic habits and water saving.
- Train those in charge of the water supplies.
- Promote systems for water access or treatment functioning with renewable energy.

### 1.3 Sustainable development and fight against climate change:

- Reforestation and prevention of deforestation (protection of natural woods).
- Change the uses of land, forest and improve agricultural management in order to reduce greenhouse gases.
- Develop renewable energy projects.
- Improve energy efficiency.
- Replace fossil fuels and high power substances and find clean and renewable alternatives for heating.
- Eliminate dump sites.
- Value the project according to the gain or reduction of equivalent CO2 emissions to the atmosphere.

## GEOGRAPHICAL PRIORITIES

The geographical field of action of the Andorran Government's policy of cooperation for development extends to all countries and regions of the world, and gives priority to the neediest people, in accordance with the lists established by international organizations. At the same time, and as a result of the Andorran membership to the Organisation Internationale de la Francophonie, the Latin Union and the Iberoamerica Conference, Andorra gives greater importance to member states of one of these organisations. We also consider a priority those countries having bilateral agreements with Andorra.







## 2. actors and partners in Andorran cooperation

---

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, through the Department of Multilateral Affairs and Cooperation, is the principal actor of the cooperation for development, and has a budgetary section assigned to cooperation reaching the 22% of the ministry's total budget. To implement this section, the Department carries out a valuable task in defining priorities and criteria. It rigorously manages the budgetary allocation and is always alert to needs and appeals for help for the emergencies and catastrophe situations which can appear in any part of the world. It also coordinates with non-governmental organisations the process of awarding subsidies to civil entities and channels its budget through bilateral agreements or contributing to projects managed by international bodies.


Andorran, City Councils have also contributed to projects of cooperation for development, often participating in accordance with the framework of the international organizations they have joined.

The Andorran civic entities are the second actor in cooperation. Andorran civil society is sensitive to challenges of social cohesion and joint development. It demonstrates its involvement through non-profit institutions of a social nature which have grown in number and means year after year. Many of these institutions combine their actions at local level, through assistance to the less favoured sectors of Andorran society, with an international vocation which mobilises part of their resources and is destined to projects of cooperation in developing countries.



### \*Distribution according to type of cooperation:




### \*Geographical distribution:

## 4. multilateral cooperation



Multilateral cooperation is one of the most important instruments in the service of the Andorran Government's cooperation policy. Through it, the Government contributes to programmes of international bodies which work on strategic objectives in accordance with the priorities of Andorran international cooperation.

Multilateral cooperation gives support principally to the agencies, programmes and funds of the United Nations, the Council of Europe, UNESCO, the FAO, the OSCE, the Organisation Internationale de la Francophonie and the Iberoamerica General Secretariat, but also finances specific projects in accordance with the sectorial and geographical priorities of the Master Plan for Andorran cooperation for development.

## 5. emergencies



An essential part of the Andorran budget dedicated to international cooperation is allocated in contributing humanitarian and emergency aid in the event of natural disasters or armed conflicts, with the aim of saving threatened human lives, helping refugees and internally displaced people, and reconstructing the physical, economic and social infrastructures devastated by the disasters and conflicts.

In this context the Government collaborates in emergency actions through three ways: through international bodies (World Food Programme, Food and Agriculture Organisation, Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, International Red Cross, etc.), from the Andorran NGO platform or Andorran associations with representation in the countries affected and, finally, through collaboration with local governments and NGOs in the areas affected.





## 7. subsidies to Andorran civic entities



Civic entities are understood as non-profit legally constituted associations, with full legal capacity to operate, the constitutional purpose of which is carrying out activities of international cooperation for development. Their headquarters have to be in Andorra and they must be registered in the Government Register of Associations.

Other actors are non-profit entities with the headquarters in the Principality of Andorra and wishing to carry out projects of international cooperation for development and that are not ruled by the Qualified Law of Associations, of 29 December 2000.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs grants subsidies to civic entities legally established in the country and to those other actors which carry out activities of international cooperation for social development in developing countries.



## 8. conclusion

---

In spite of the firm commitment made at the Millennium Summit, the goals set for 2015 remain far from being achieved.

We share the planet with 1,440 million people who live below the poverty line, subsisting on less than one euro a day. More than 1,100 million people, 18% of the people in the world, have no access to clean drinking water. Every day 4,500 children die for this reason. 2,400 million people have no adequate health system. In Mali, Mozambique, Somalia, Niger, Liberia, Afghanistan, Sierra Leone and Angola nearly 15% of the born children do not reach 5 years of age.

Perhaps we were excessively ambitious and optimistic in setting these goals. It is also true that, recalling the world scene in 2000, no-one could have foreseen the events which have taken place during the last decade: the proliferation of new forms of terrorism, the depth of the economic crises, the extreme volatility in fuel and food prices, the pandemics, the local conflicts and natural disasters which have created new challenges. Almost every state has suffered in some way the consequences of some of these events, and many have reacted by channelling their efforts towards domestic troubles and have demoted to a second rank the great challenges which they wished to achieve by 2015.

The end of the three-year period reviewed in this report coincides with the beginning of the last three years of the the journey towards 2015. Although the indicators show that much work remains to be done, it must be said that not everything is negative. The efforts done in response to the Millennium Declaration are unprecedented and we can see today a clear reversal of the trends. There is still a lot to do, but the establishment of the Millennium Development Goals has been fundamental in achieving this change of trend.

From the modesty of our small dimensions I animate you all to share these goals.


